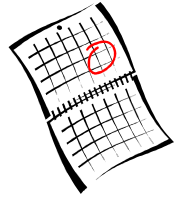
SNOWFLAKE LEAGUE

A Note from your Treasurer



Over the last few years, our membership has flourished. We have reached our maximum of 500 members last year and again this year. And this year we have several dozen people on a wait list for the coming membership year. However, this growth does not come without problems. There are still so many people who have not fulfilled their commitments to give our club the time they promised by paying a reduced

dues rate. And the money due our club is substantial, over \$7,500.

So, it is in the best financial interest of our club, that we remove the option to pay a reduced rate **up front**. Instead, we will be charging everyone the **full dues rate of \$300** for the membership year starting 04/01/2014. The exceptions are for those who qualify for **'Senior' status \$150** (age 65 or older and a member in good standing for 5 years or more) and **'Junior' status \$150** (age 13-18 and recommended by a member in good standing).

Then, when a member helps out our club by working on shoots, events, workdays, committees or special projects in 2014, we will credit that member's account up to \$100. When renewal time comes around again in 2015, that member will owe the \$300 less their credits applied, for a balance due as low as \$200. In February 2014, when the invoices go out for the new membership year, the bill will be \$300 plus any unpaid dues from work hours not completed. Prior years unpaid balances must be paid in full before membership can be considered for the 2014 membership year. With a wait list building, it would be in our members' best interests to make sure they are in good standing with our club so renewal of memberships are not declined due to unpaid dues.

It is a wonderful thing to see our club build and grow in so many ways, and there are so many members to thank for these accomplishments. And many times we see the same faces helping out whether or not they have work hours to fulfill. It is this spirit that makes Suffolk Archers such a great club. Although we all benefit from the hard work of these individuals, we should not take from them their 'credit due'. They worked hard; they deserve the 'credit' — pun intended.

PRODUCT REVIEW

Work Sharp Knife & Tool Sharpener

I am sure many people like myself have tried many knife sharpening tools, gadgets and systems over the years. Each one with various success, one gave excellent results but required more time setting up the guides than it actually took to sharpen the knife, another one only gave me mediocre results at best and I even had one that promised to produce a razor sharp edge just by dragging the knife blade across two steel rods but in reality it left me with a knife that was worse than before I started. I have found the key to getting a good edge on a knife is not only holding the knife at the proper angle, but to maintain that angle throughout the entire length of the blade, which can be a difficult and frustrating task. Needless to say, sharpening knives was a chore.

I have come across a product made by DAREX Industries called the " Work Sharp Knife and Tool Sharpener" which makes sharpening knives a quick, easy and enjoyable job. I was so impressed after I sharpened the very first knife, I went on to sharpen all the knives in the house.

I have been using the WSKTS for over a year, and I am still pleased with its performance. The WSKTS is basically a small hand held belt sander using replaceable abrasive belts. It runs on 120 volts, so this is not something you would take into the field. The kit includes several guides; 40°



for kitchen knives, 50° for outdoor and pocket knives, 65° for scissors and a guide for single sided serrated knives. The kit also comes with an assortment of abrasive belts, an easy to read user manual and a quick reference card. The unit is made of a durable composite material with metal belt rollers and has a 6 foot non detachable power cord. I also features a 3 position power switch, momentary on, off and continuously on. No tools are needed to quickly change the guides or belts. Although I have only used the WSKTS for knives and scissors, the WSKTS will sharpen axes / hatchets, lawnmower blades and other garden tools. The WSKTS comes with a 1 year warranty, by the way, DAREX will send you a free set of abrasive belts upon completing the warranty registration.

The kit comes with 80 grit aluminum oxide, 220 grit ceramic oxide and 6000 grit silicon carbide belts. After the initial sharpening, 2 or 3 passes with the 220 grit belt followed by several passes with the 6000 grit honing belt is all that is required to give you an extremely sharp knife in about 3 minutes. Belt life varies depending on the condition and material of the blade, harder steel and blades that are in poor condition will wear a belt faster. You can expect to re-sharpen 20 or more knives with a belt. Replacement belts come in packages of 6 for about \$10 from the manufacturer.

The WSKTS is available direct from the manufacturer for \$89.95, it is also available from Amazon, Cabela's and many other retailers. If you buy directly from DAREX, the TV Promo deal is a great bargain. For less than \$10 more, you get; an additional set of belts, instructional

DVD, retractable honing rod, tote bag to keep everything in and free shipping and handling. If you are looking for a versatile knife sharpener that will produce an extremely sharp edge on just about every knife in your home then I would highly recommend the "Work Sharp Knife and Tool Sharpener" from DAREX. 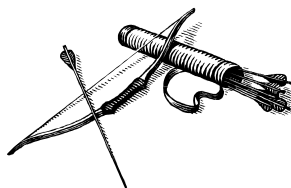
Recently I was digging through some old issues of The Arrow looking for inspiration and guidance, and in doing so I found an old friend. Here is a recipe from December 2006 submitted by Mike Jones, one of our former presidents.

- ◆ 3lbs Ground Venison
 - ◆ 1 Large Onion Grated
 - ◆ 1/4 cup Water
 - ◆ 14 oz Bottle of Catsup
 - ◆ 1 12oz can of Beer
 - ◆ Salt, Pepper & Garlic Powder to taste
1. Combine the meat and seasonings by mixing with hands
 2. Form mixture into bite sized (1/2-3/4") meatballs.
 3. Heat the water, catsup and beer in a saucepan. Carefully drop meatballs in the liquid and simmer **SLOWLY** for 1 hour.
 4. Serve Buck Balls and sauce in a chafing dish or over your favorite pasta. (Serves 8 –10)

Tackle Tips

How To Care For Your Compound Bow

Buying a compound bow is a big investment; it's not one you want to make every year and is certainly not one you have to make every year. Even if you're just getting started, there are compound bows that adjust to grow with you, and depending on your age when you start, may be the only bow you need to buy.



Yes, there are those who need the "latest" and "newest" every year or every other year, but to truly enjoy the sport of archery, you really only need to invest once maybe twice in a compound bow. Now like most things worth investing in, it should be worth investing the time to properly take care of, because the key to a successful hunt is a well maintained bow.

So how do you take care of a compound bow? The first and probably the most important part of taking care of your bow, is purchasing a bow case. When is the last time you spent a lot of money on something and left it set outside in the elements? In the back of your truck or hanging in your garage is not a good place for this investment. Excessive heat, dampness, dirt and pests, all play a big role in deteriorating your compound bow. Proper storage in either a hard sided case or a soft sided case is very beneficial.

The next thing you should pay attention to, is the Bow Strings and Cables. Bowstrings and cables need to be frequently and regularly waxed. This will help keep them strong and from becoming fuzzy and worn. Inspect your strings and cables after each use and look for signs of "fuzziness" then give them a wax treatment. Get into the habit of doing this and you will be confident that your bow will withstand hunting in damp conditions and your strings and cables will remain strong.

Other areas to pay attention to are your axles and bushings, for these you want to use a good bow oil, (you're manual should have this information) give them a few drops after each outing into the brush. Some compound bows don't require this kind of lubrication, so you want to make sure you check your manual first.

Always, always, always check your bow limbs for cracks, dents, or any sign of ware, before and after you shoot. And then always have a professional look at and fix the problem. Your warranty should cover this. Never try to fix this on your own. And then check limb bolts and tighten any that are loose, a simple set of Allen wrenches is all you need. Finally wipe down your compound bow of any dirt and grime from the days outing.

By doing these few simple steps each and every time you use your bow will keep you confident of its ability to perform well, and will help in making your investment last for years to come.

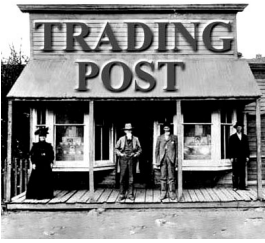
